TRIP ACROSS THE PLAINS (pp. 3-7)

I was one of those advrs wo left the Gfeen Mrs of Vermont. . . to Boston, NY, Phil, Cinc, SL, and Independence. Here I joined the first mule train of Turner, Allen & Co.s, Pioneer Line. . 40 yms, 150 mules, 150 pasngrs. . left frontier May 14, and here is where r hardships commenced. . mule for trouble. . . cooking fiasco first nite out, Little Blue R. . .

from cholera we lost about 75 of r number bf we reached FL, 700 m from I. . When near Fort Childs. . all the paingrs left the wgs, and walked on in advance. . . we pursued j along SEP until we reached FL. . the first place of ints. . was a narrow passage for the river between 2 perpendicular rocky banks. . called Devila Gate. . priaire dog vills, soti sev hundred acres.

We I now pass to another ints, object called CR ch is not ltogether unlike Bunker Hill Monument. . altogether 200 feet hi. . . one of r co attempt to ford Flatte on foot. . while hesitating between 2 opinions his feet had rkd down tino the quicksand and be became emibeeded. . gave Masonic Grand hailing sign of distress and in a moment there er sev men, on their way to his relief. .

The next 300mi er devoid of any special ints. This brings us to the summit of the RMs, crossed July 19. . 21st brot us to Green River, swollen. Here we brot r pontoons in into use and swam the mules. . . Steamboat Springs. . Subletts Cutoff. . trings us to the lase of the mts at the source of the H-R. . . . Slippery Ford, now called Devils Half-Acre, smooth inclined rock.

Abut 40 m south from sink of the H-- is ld Ragtown on Carson r, not far from Fort Churchill... Six Mile Canyon the roughtest piece of road yet.

Arr at Waverville, sept 10, 3 miles below Kangtown (now Placerville). .

Margaret Long, The Shadow of the Arrow (Caxton, Caldwell, Idaho, 1950) Appendix A, "The Sheldon Young Log", pp. 257-280

Sheldon Young was a member of the Jayhawkers of 1849, who were lost in the desert between the Spanish Trail at \$41 Little Salt Lake and the Pacific Coast. Following is the correct copy of the log of ths man kept between Joliet, Illinois and the Spanish San Fransicquito Rancho in California. .

The original log has been preserved by his son, Lewis C. Young of Rutland, Illinois, along w/ his daguerrotype, both of ch 3717 put in the poss. o John B. Colton, who afterward tried for 20 yrs to locate him. . Cs of change residence no trace oth Jayhawker cdb foung until March, 1897. The diary is written w/ pencil and in some portions not distinct enough to be read -- from Mar 28 to April 13 -- the writing is nearly effaced. It shows, however, that after leavy Galesburg the Mississippi River was crossd at Fort Madison and thence to Centerville / Iowa

6/2 Hard ct f grass & water. . 7 B killed near camp this mg 6/4 hard-looking country. . plenty of pears. . 9 miles, halted near the South Fork (Platte), and crossed in afternoon. . Plenty of Indians. .

8 m., 9 m. . 11 m. to the bottom. . Blowing a harricane. .

12 m up South Fork of the Platte, and across to the North Fork.

6/8 15 m. . 5 m 0 came to Ash Hollow. . There the upper ford road of the F South Fork comes in. . gr display of natural architecture. . . passed 2 camps where they had the cholera

6/10 / XXX Chimney Rock in sight.

6/11/ 10 m and halted abreast of Castle Rock, or the court house 6/12 8 m over quicksand roads. . abreast CR. . wagons mean mired down in quicksand

6/13 Plenty of prickly pears. . 6 m, then the road leaves the bottom and takes a circuitous route around Scottis Bluff . . 5 m from where the road leaves the Bottom, there is a g spring of water and plenty of wood . .

. . went 9 m and camped near (blank) on the side of a bluff where a man d of cholera. . plenty of water off to the left hand in a ravine.

6/14 12 m across Horse Creek. . one co. from Mo. lay at Horse

Creek w/ 3 cases of cholera.

- 6/17 Crossed the Larmie River. Went 12 miles and of saw nothing ve intersg about the Fort, nothing but mud walls to be seen. . The road leaves the river. .
- 6/18 . . they v thrown away bacon & flour. . 4 ton weight, and 5 wagons

6/19 Commenced climbing the Rhankxkikkax black hills.

6/22 Struck the Platte. . Doc Whitmore traded hs team and wg f horses and packs. . there is about 200 teams here waiting to get across. . 2 m. up river and waited for a raft. . cattle zz acrosss. . 6 men drowned here ths spring. . 3 or 4 & canoes fastened together.

7/22 Potter and another to mountains and had a good snowball.

7/5. . man arrested for murderg a man that was packing. . Took his horses and \$400 and put out. He committed the act on the Platte.

7/6 . . Climbed on top of the mountains, camped near a large snow-drift. We crossed the Sweetwater. .

9 m to South Pass - 4 m to Pacific Springs. . dead oxen. 7/8 16 m. to Junction of SI and Sublets Cutoff. . Little Sandy

7/11 . . Big Sandy. . Came to Green River and found it not fordable. Mormon ferry boats. .across same day. . There is not half as many teams taken that has the Come Cut-off. . . (?)

7/12 Went 25 m and fod the Green R, then left and went 15 m to Black Fork 7/14 / 4 m from Fort Bridges (sic)

7/15 . . passed the Fort. . Utah Indians, a rabher malicious race

7/16 Sulphur Creek

7/17 to Bear River. . worst Ford yet. . all down hill

7/17 Crossed Red Fork six times. . . lofty mts both sides

7/18 Webber River. . Wind River (Wasatch) Mts. (The SL Trail in 1949 descended Emigration Canyon from Little Mt. to SLC. . Later the rt was 1/ changed from E/to Parley's Canyon)

7/22 Moved on to the City. Houses mostly of clay, unburned brick. .

7/23 camp west side city. . stay through the winter? . Potter succeded in trading his cattle for fresh ones and went on.

7/24 / Gr Celebrations here on the M landing of pionners in '47

7/25 / Long trains keep coming in. . teams look bad. . They can beat Illinois or any part of the states . . for raising cattle. Cattle do well here yr around w/o any feeding. . People are industrious, hardworking. There was nothing very alarming, only rumos and scare-crow stories.

7/25 Lefth the city on the South Broute [old Spanish Trail]

7/28 Distressg times on the road. . gr many returng to M settlement . gr/may lost teams and er taking it max afoot .. . Fort Provo . . .

7/30. . . Itend to by by Santa Fe Trail (OST) route, it bg too late to go by the Northern Route (across Salt Lake Desert, to the Humboldt R etc.) Lay in camp from July 30 to October 1. . .

2/5/50. .arr SF or Newhall Ranch (Santa Clara River). (closes the "log". last fly-leaf, m. per day, adding to 777 from ISL on the Spanish Trail to the Rancho//)
