

Having a common interest we unloaded our supplies, taking only what w/s supposed to be enough to type us to FB out late in Oct

at head of Echo Canyon we encird our first snow storm arrv FB and ound that had not anything to sell. Here we were as it was over 400 miles to FL and nothing to eat, a council was cd consisitng of a comm of the whole camp much time was taken up in tryg to decide whetehr the party in SL wgi advised us o leave our u supplies and depend on getting more on the road acted from sinister motives, whether we er to go back t' SL and fight it out during the winter with the others, or go ahead

moment but what we cd get what we wanted at FL so it a was unan decided to go ahead and depend on game

This w/z's made more easy by our exper of being on Beef alone when we first arrived in SC and that B er supposed to be plenty Well we strd on what rove urlv proved to be a 900 mile jaunt in midwinter w/o anything to eat

By scrimping we managed to et over on SW where we kd a B and fared sumptuously, at length we reached FL where we expected e relief but he when only 24 lbs of dried B meat coud be had at any price it looked rather blue, we cdn go back, we cd n stay, nor cd we cross the prairie land

Another Guncil was called and decided to go ahead and depend on the B, so away we went.

Near Scots Bluffs we got a genuine snow storm, freezing 9 mules to death, and generally demoralizing the balance, besides to add to our tr the snow ch as about 8 inches on the evel ad covered up the rass, and

had covered up the grass, and driven the B to the hills, where i r jaded animals we cdn reach them but we went on, in the course of the day Wm Maxwell and others succeeded in wounding an old blind Bull that was t [oo decreped to go off with the rest, and after some time wqs spent, they k finally killed him tough must vbn left by Noah

We ad now left the timber line and was dep on what was termed B chips, for fuel, and that under 8 inches of snow, but e lived and dug out fuel, made fires and roasted the old Ante-deluvian Bull and moved on

After ~~any~~ days of starvg and roasted Bull meat, in frozen snow, we saw the timber on the head of GI here one of Rainey's donkeys decided to conclude he d g n further. . drive him into camp at GI and they d kill him and thus draw wolves from ch we d get our supper but the donkey changed his mind and decided to press on

At camp Elisha Averett and Abram Hunsucker tooi the poor d from me, put a cr rope around his neck and armed with their old flintlock musekts led him off to the nearest tree where he was shot, hung up and skinned for the benefit of wolves, but the fact was, it froze as a fast s the hide was taken off and no wolves er in sight to shoot Now Dennett getting tired of waiting for wolves, took his knife and cut off a large piece from the Donkeys ribs and threw it on the fire; the stnc' stench was immense /but/ / in a few moments poor D was on the ire roasting and men cutting off slices and eating as cooked Here was a discovery. . after this we always had a mule for supper ???

LF further tr the river had frozen over, except a few feet in the center, and that was washed out till it was deep enough to flag float a steamboat, after testing it we decided to keep down on this side to the P Reserv and there pos get a boat. . found it deserted, and no boat, then we had to wait for the river to f freeze up . . . fell some cottonwoods into the channel, block the ice (a dam) but it was a week bf it was considered safe to cross

on the mg appd to cross a band of sev hundr PI's pounced down upon us, and showed war-like intentions but after cg into camp nd finding hules heads and lights lyg around loose, they seemed to change their minds, became fr, took some of the oys home with them, feasted them on fat dog meat, then bloaeded wh em with corn, tild turkey etc. From here to WQ we had no further tr except to wade thru snow and slush arr day or two before Christmas 1847




