Camp No. 43 - 135 miles above Fort Hays on the South Fork  
of the Platte 5/20/50

I avail myself of the return of the Captain of 1 to the state,  
to write you a few lines to let you know how I am progressing - we left  
on the 16th leaving the state line (the last place from which I wrote you) we travel  
about 50 miles down the "Shawnee" river. These are a hilly, thickish  
looking set - by about 400 - we then came to Pottawatomie Station,  
a small town on the fork called "Umtanum" at the crossing of the Kansas River.  
This town consists of about 50 log houses, up pop 300 - here physician, 2 bids,  
wagon maker, 2 gunsmiths, & a circular saw mill.

Crossing at the Kansas, we encamped near the hotel of one, who had  
the U.S. flag flying proudly over his house, habitation a gaudy ugly  
looking old steamer and a large thatch roof, but we had nothing to  
fear from them; as they only wanted whiskey, an article which was prohibited.

After 4 hours 10 min., we arrived at the P-mission, situated at the  
crossroads of the cross roads - it is a neat hilly place consisting of  
3 or 4 two story log houses & about 20 smaller log houses. There is here  
a very large farm, & seen the B.W. Indian mission

A few miles farther we find the Little Vermillion - here a French  
man of his family called to see him professionally as sick child - they  
were able to read & write - Indian number above 4,000. . .

It was a level spot where part of the lodges were placed, the other was under a small hill - Ranch - the camp was in the ~~back~~ heart of the village. I saw two lodges that was a cut of the "Bull," they are 10' ft to 8'. the Lieutenant, Captain w/ 9 fine soldiers, last day there lived in the camp, and their carcasses are still there, the flesh eaten by wolves. 
