- > Left Barry, Clay Co. Mo. 4/21/1850 Sunday, in g order w/ 3 wags - 16 yoke oxen - 1 horse - Geo Stone & Jas. C. Martin w/ prov. w/ Hughes & Waring Rf. Wm. Elliott & J. O. Gout w/ 2 wags - Free Traders, Justice Wm. Richards & J. O. Gout w/ 2 wags behind - to Farmer W. C. 17 mi
- > 4/22 Left Barry - shelled corn - A. Hamilton com up & w. side of us - W. C.
- > 4/23 Shed at W. C.'s - J. P. Reed w/ 4 men & 1 w/ come up
- > 4/24 Leave w/ W. C.'s team - many - 6 wags, 31 yoke oxen & 18 men, 6 horse
- > 4/25 Found Little Platte at the Agency - cp 3 mi of 8 J

- 4/26 - 27 Cpl. Cole 3 1/2 mi SE of Wagon River 15
- 4/28 Crossed Wagon R. - found & repul of 7 1/2 wags 20 16 1/2
- 4/29 - Stay at G. Stapp's, 2 Lt. teams 12 1/2
- 5/2 - To Hank's Ferry - made camp to cross STE mt 8
- 5/3 Go to Wagon 50 +
- 5/4 To Big ~~St. Joe?~~ where?
- 5/10 Began to cross - Start crossing lightfoot - Savannah went down
- 5/11 all over rock
- 5/12 To the hospital - oiled - me w/ meat

5/13 To Big Wagon - Cross of wags 2 canoes & 3 logs final together - Boards laid over - 259 ponies - take - Brook w/ 4 wags

5/14 To NE - collected 11 wags of dear wants to go fast

5/15 NO road meat

5/16 at about Nashua - in Wagon water # - 10 horse w/ prov - in by the way of the river to the west of the mountain range of the Rockies

5/17 - 18 To LeBarre, on at the river (8 mi to Salt Creek) 30' w, 5' deep

5/19 Sun - fun = Salt meat, really salty - Brook to the west of the mountain range of the Rockies wags left in great order - about 200 ponies longer - part of 30 teams

5/20 To Cottwood with a large unit

5/21 - 22 To Bottom Big Platte - crossed the river of the Rockies 100 yoke wags

5/24 (4 + 16 + 14 to all the ponies) descended 2-3 yrs, on the bank of the river 150 to 200 hds, 50 more if you of all the foundations - 40' dia, all down east - instead of west - called a creek to the west - fields at the end of the river 2 mi to the west - all made of gran rocks - 1/4 mi E apt of the river of the Rockies, more together, salt
