✓ ✓ Denway 57. NB Same near SB, where heathen says a  
man was left by his opinions to die, in defiance of his  
own request. His fellow-travels were infoold, & knowing  
that he could live, he begged them to abandon him  
to seek their own lives. A party, when crossing the bluffs  
soke afternoon, found the bones - some dirt of the place  
where the infat. trav had last been seen.
